Concordat between the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Surrey, Surrey Police and Surrey County Council

General principles:

- We will at all times work together for the best interests of Surrey people
- We will uphold the Nolan principles in working together and carrying out our respective functions: *Selflessness; Integrity; Objectivity; Accountability; Openness; Honesty; Leadership*
- We will work together to safeguard and promote the welfare of adults and children in all our diverse communities, ensuring we hear their voice and respond to their needs and interests.
- We will work together and intervene as early as possible to address the common factors that bring people into contact with the police and criminal justice system and lead to poor health
- We will continue to innovate the deployment of first responders to keep the people of Surrey safe and well, whether that be through daily activities, the response to major incidents, or in the planning for emergencies
- We will work together to design and co-commission services and projects within our communities which improve safety, reduce offending and support those affected by crime
- We will be committed to problem-solving in all parts of the County – from the most rural to the most urban - supporting Community Safety Partnerships and sharing learning through the Community Safety Board and Health and Wellbeing Board
- We will co-locate resources where this makes good business sense, fostering a culture of shared understanding and joint problem-solving
- We will support Joint Enforcement Teams as they work to deal with a wide range of local issues including anti-social behaviour and fly-tipping
- We will continue to promote close partnership working to improve safety on Surrey's roads with joint projects such as Drive SMART
- We will seek out future opportunities for collaboration amongst local emergency services, other councils and other police forces

- We will work together to call upon the Government for a fairer funding deal for Surrey
- We will foster a relationship which is mutually respectful
- We will exchange information in an open and accountable way
- We will work to resolve any difficulties in a constructive and open manner
- We will ensure that our staff in both of our organisations work together well, with mutual respect for each of their respective roles.
